

is a catalog-based post-processing application. It can organize and speed up the entire editing processing of your photography.

He emphasized that members need to develop a method for organizing and processing their digital photographs. James's presentation was emailed out to all the members to help them get started on Lightroom and organizing.

## Mute Swans Steal the Show

There were several warm spells in late January and continuing on in mid-February. Long Point Inner Bay remained largely open throughout the winter allowing many waterfowl such as Tundra Swans to overwinter or arrive early in the bay at Long Point, Ontario. This was a great time to photography these magnificent birds. Tony Sheldon, an avid bird watcher headed out to the Point to capture some images of Tundra Swans, however these Mute Swans stole the show. With their beaks touching, their slender necks formed a perfect heart shape. Tony was in the right place and at the right time to capture this beautiful moment.

Hundreds of Tundra Swans and Sandhill Cranes found a resting place before they travelled on. There were also thousands of ducks migrating through the area, mostly canvasbacks and redheads. Explore the Long Point Birding Trail. Updates of the birds in the area can be viewed through eBird on LPBO's main webpage. You can help contribute to sightings in the Long Point area by submitting your sightings.


